Intentional Interim Update

Two weeks from Sunday, we will be celebrating our second Easter without everyone worshiping in person. None of us ever thought it would be this long. This year, we will have an outdoor option for a sunrise service on Easter Sunday at 7:30 a.m. The Moravian Church in Germany gets credit for the first sunrise service held in 1732. Churches today hold sunrise services to remember the gospel accounts of those who came to the tomb at dawn to discover that the tomb was empty. To gather for worship outside on Easter morning is a meaningful way to celebrate resurrection and this year we surely need to affirm this hope!

Please know that your Worship Team and session are exploring options for in-person worship and you are encouraged to share your thoughts with them. One helpful resource we are using is a document called Holding Our Plans Loosely: Returning to Church 2.0 from the Wisconsin Council of Churches. I recommend that we all read it. The document is based on the following values:

- 1. Prioritize the life and health of your neighbor.
- 2. Let yourself continue to be provoked into holy experiments.
- 3. Follow the call to love and good deeds urgently and care-fully.
- 4. Prioritizing accessibility honors the diversity and one-ness of Christ's church.
- 5. Take seriously the church's role as community leader.
- 6. Believe in the resilience of the church.

As we make our way toward our celebration of resurrection of Easter Sunday, may that same resurrection power bring new life and sustain us as we continue to be a faithful church that loves our neighbor be it remotely, or in person... wherever we are.

One Great Hour of Sharing

In the U.S., We the People of Detroit (WPD), a community-based grassroots organization that "aims to inform, educate, and empower Detroit residents on imperative issues surrounding civil rights, land, water, education and the democratic process," is similarly strengthening its commitment to water justice and water access through the One Great Hour of Sharing and its Presbyterian Mission Agency (PMA) partner, Self-Development of People.

"We were immediately attracted to WPD because of the PMA's Matthew 25 invitation, which calls us to serve the 'least of these,' in this case, those who are most affected by water shut-offs," said the Rev. Alonzo Johnson, coordinator of the Presbyterian Committee on the Self-Development of People. "Just imagine how you would survive during a pandemic without water to wash your hands. This organization is a good amalgam of community activists and scholars who work to educate and mobilize the residents of Detroit, especially those living in poverty — not only about water, but also other basic human needs and rights."
