Friends,

After we recorded the podcast this past week, Eddie Adams mentioned the following poem by Wendell Berry (b. 1934) as one that is meaningful to him, especially in challenging times like these. I invite you to read it, paying special attention to the emotions that are expressed.

The Peace of Wild Things

When despair for the world grows in me and I wake in the night at the least sound in fear of what my life and my children's lives may be, I go and lie down where the wood drake rests in his beauty on the water, and the great heron feeds. I come into the peace of wild things

who do not tax their lives with forethought of grief. I come into the presence of still water. And I feel above me the day-blind stars waiting with their light. For a time I rest in the grace of the world, and am free.

Despair, sleeplessness and fear spark movement.

These emotions propel the poet to nature, to the places where ducks rest and birds feed, to be among those who do not worry about the future.

These emotions propel the poet to water, to the place of stillness where stars wait to be seen, to a moment of rest and freedom.

As I reflect on Berry's poem, I hear echoes of another:

The Twenty-Third Psalm

The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want.

He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters.

He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake.

Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me.

Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies:

thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over.

Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

Shadow, death and fear are relieved.

Relieved through the comfort of God's presence, through guiding rod and staff in a table spread with God's bounty.

Relieved through pastoral places, green pastures and still waters, paths of restoration and righteousness.

In this season of dis-ease,

I invite you to notice and identify your emotions: notice what movement they spark, where might they propel you to go?

I encourage you to consider and reflect on the Shepherd's Way: where are your green pastures and still waters? how is God anointing you and filling your cup?

An Update from the Saint Giles Session:

The Saint Giles Session has passed a motion to abide by the orders made by Wake County per campus and meeting closings and safety; and that when such orders are lifted, the Saint Giles Session will revisit decisions related to worship and on-campus activities.

Secondly, in late March, Congress passed the CARES Act. The Act included a provision allowing for churches to obtain a loan through their bank to cover payroll and payroll related costs for two and a half months. If churches continue to employ their personnel, the loan becomes a grant and does not need to be repaid.

On March 31st, the Saint Giles Session approved a motion to have Treasurer Dave Gospodarek, Finance Ministry Elder Liaison Scott Vollmer, and Clerk of Session Elizabeth Abernathy complete a Corporate Resolution, allowing Saint Giles to apply for funding through the act.

This is a significant support, allowing Saint Giles to continue to care for our employees during this time, at no net cost to the church.
